# Reading Aloud: Using punctuation to pause.

**Commas ,**

**Full stops .**



## Note

- When we read aloud we should use the punctuation marks we see (the commas and full stops) to pause.
- When we see a comma, we should make a small pause.
- When we see a full stop, we should make a longer pause.
- Let's practise together with these sentences from the *Superino* story...

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**super-duper  
super powers**



But the Ranterino didn't know  
A place where he could go  
And be given, or find, or buy, or get  
Such super-duper super powers  
Like super-sight and super-speed,  
And super-strength for a super-fight,  
Or, of course, super-flight!

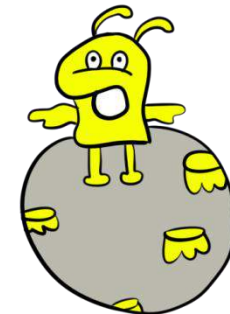
